This week I have had meaningful discussions about eternity with the waiter at On The Border, three teenagers at the same restaurant, a car sales person, the cashier at Central Market and the waiter at Sonic just to name a few. It's getting easier to hand out tracts and pocket testaments as I go about my day to day life. I would like to encourage you to do likewise.

Last Thursday, Craig, Todd and I met for lunch at Valley View Mall. We all three had a number of excellent conversations with people in the mall.

On Sunday, Todd, Eric, Jonny and I went to Texas Stadium and handed out tracts before the Cowboys-Giants football game. In a little over an hour we handed out over 350 tracts and had dozens of conversations with people. As the game was kicking off, the flow of people by where we were standing was understandably diminishing. I noticed there were a few tracts strewn in the street and left on car windows and such. So I started picking them up so

we would not leave liter behind. As I was doing this, I noticed a man and a woman walking towards us a couple hundred feet away. The woman reached down and picked up one of our tracts from the ground. She then sat down by a lamp post and started reading the tract. I watched from a distance, then decided I would go talk to her. "What do you think of what you are reading?", I asked her. "Not finished yet", she replied. I talked to her about the ten commandments, eternity, heaven and hell. She examined herself by the commandments and admitted she was concerned she would go to hell. I then shared the Gospel with her. She was really overcome with emotion and her face was twitching just below her left eye. I said, "Would you like to receive Jesus Christ as your savior and Lord right now?". "YES!", came her reply. So I explained to her that she could talk to God in prayer. She prayed right there in the median of the road to receive Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior! What someone thought was trash and dropped at the side of the road, God used to save DeAngela for all eternity. What a humbling thing to pick up what appears to be trash and sit down and read it. This reminded me of Matthew 15:27 where the woman says even the dogs can eat the crumbs that fall from the table.
