The Law as a Mirror

"Go therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son, and the Holy Spirit..." Matthew 28:19

This week our church held its annual Vacation Bible School. VBS brings in some 400 kids from the surrounding community to enjoy Bible stories, games, skits and hearing about the love of Jesus. I was asked to present the Gospel to the group of firth thru fifth graders - about 150 of the 400 kids. Since I don't normally witness to children in this age group, I re-listened to Ray Comfort's message titled "How to Bring Your Children to Christ and Keep Them There" which is available at the Living Waters web site in audio and book format. One of the main points he makes is to teach them the ten commandments. I decided that a few object lessons would probably be more memorable than anything I could actually say. I started in Mark 10 with the story of the rich young man talking to Jesus about eternal life. Jesus uses the ten commandments to show this man that although he thought he was good, he had broken the first commandment and money was his god before God. So, I pulled out an egg and dropped it. It splattered into a bowl that I had placed below. I asked the kids why it broke.



When I buy gas, I like to leave tracts like this one in the credit card slot for the next person to read. Yesterday, I witnessed to the person at the next pump. He believed in his own religion that was different from Catholic, Baptist, etc. He believed in his own good works. I told him the Bible said his good works are filthy rags. He said he does not believe that. So I asked him to read the tract I had handed him. He agreed and drove off.

"You dropped it", one of them called out. I explained that the egg broke because it broke the law of gravity. I then explained that God would have to punish us if we broke the ten commandments. I took out a mirror and had the kids call out the ten commandments. As they did I

wrote them on the mirror with a sharpie. "Lie", "Steal", "Covet", they called out. I helped them with a few. Eventually we had them all there. Then I told them that James tells us that if we break one commandment we are guilty of breaking them all. I let them look into the mirror and see the "sins" listed there showing them the ten commandments are a mirror to show us our sin. I asked them which commandment they wanted me to break. "Lie", they called out. So I put the mirror in a big zip lock bag, sealed it, put it on the ground and struck "lie" with a hammer. The mirror shattered into hundreds of pieces showing them that even breaking one commandment breaks them all. I asked them if God judges them by the ten commandments would he find them innocent or guilty. "Guilty", they called out. Then I asked if he would send them to heaven or hell. "Hell", they called out. So then I talked to them about the perfect gift, of Jesus, repentance of sin and putting their trust in Christ. After VBS ended we handed out Good Person tracts and they were all standing around reading them. Seeds were planted!
