Last Saturday we witnessed at the Plano Balloon Festival. We had many engaging conversations and handed out over 200 tracts! I enjoyed using several spring boards to the Gospel. One that is particularly fun is to present the person with a hypothetical situation where they are blind and walking towards a deadly fall off of a cliff. Then ask them if they would want me to warn them of the deadly fall. Most sane people will say that they would want to be warned. At this point I transition to asking the person what they think will happen when they die. One guy told me he was not sure. So I asked him if he had any spiritual beliefs. His wife interjected "we're working on it". We spoke for a couple of minutes and he told me he was a universalist. I asked him what he meant by that and he would not expand on it at all. He had a friend there with him, so I asked his friend what he thought happens when you die. He told me that "it's private". I tried to make a joke of it saying I had never heard of that religion. He then told me he would not discuss it with me because he did not know me. So I invited him to meet me for coffee so we could get to know each other and then talk about it. I asked him when

would be a good time to have coffee. His reply was "never". Not feeling like my questions about universalism were answered, I contacted the pastor of the universalist church that is near where we were witnessing. He emailed me back three sermons that he has preached. The first attachment is a sermon from a funeral service he did. In it he states, "And so, in closing this memorial service, we commend the essence of our brother to what ever fate he may have pre-selected from our convenient after life catalogue. He was always a private man and since he did not list his afterlife choice with his

family or the church office we can only wish him the best, where ever he may be. Amen." The sermon text indicates (pause) directly after the Amen. I can only assume this is to give time for people (like me) to stop laughing! He goes on to say that they believe in heaven, but not hell. Convenient! Without hell, there is no fear of future punishment for breaking God's commandments. This frees a person to be their own God and go through life blinding believing that they will go to heaven, when their actual fate is an eternity in hell. The churches web site indicates they hold a basic tenant of searching for the truth. Jesus says he is "the way, the truth and the life" and that know one has eternal life except through him. I am now engaged in email dialogs with two universalist pastors. Please pray that the Gospel can be clearly conveyed to these leaders so that they can come to faith in Jesus Christ. I'm praying for the day when these pastors begin their sermon with "Ladies and gentlemen, This week I found the truth and his name is Jesus. Let me explain that we have all sinned against God, need to repent and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation! ..."
